## Climate Resilience by the Numbers

### 15 Years of Climate Action

In 2011, Pathfinder International's climate resilience journey started with our pioneering **population, health, and environment** (PHE) programs in Kenya, Tanzania, and Uganda. In 2017, we began launching climate-focused programming, with projects split into two tracks: **climate-centered** and **climate-responsive**. To date, Pathfinder has implemented 23 climate-focused projects across 12 countries.

#### CLIMATE-RESILIENT HEALTH FACILITIES

**1,068 health facilities** strengthened to withstand or adapt to climate shocks



#### CLIMATE-RESILIENT WORKFORCE

**18,657 individuals** trained on climate-responsive approaches



#### CLIMATE RESILIENCE AWARENESS

**3.5 million people** reached with climate-health information



#### CLIMATE-ADAPTIVE LIVELIHOODS

**5,472 individuals** adopted a new or modified livelihood that reduces climate vulnerability



#### CLIMATE ACTION PLANS

**1,038 community-level plans**, solutions, or governance mechanisms implemented to address local climate risks



#### YOUTH ENGAGEMENT IN CLIMATE ACTION

**7,613 young people** engaged in structured climate action activities

- **1,170 community members** reached with climate-health messages
- **7,068 youth** completed 12 months of climate resilience curriculum
- **1,000 women** mobilized as climate champions
- **630 providers** trained in climate-health topics
- **823 service providers** trained on Minimum Initial Service Package for SRH in crisis settings
